# Vision



Launched in 2012 and as part of Greater Montreal's economic development strategy, CargoM, the Montreal Metropolitan Logistics and Transportation Cluster, is one of 10 metropolitan clusters deployed since 2006.

Our actions are structured around 4 working groups, within which its members work collaboratively to develop and implement tools, projects and initiatives that participate in economic development, improve the fluidity of the supply chain, attract new companies, enhance jobs and training, and promote the Greater Montreal hub internationally.

CargoM's activities are financially supported by the Montreal Metropolitan Community (MMC), the Ministry of the Economy, Innovation and Energy (MEIE) and all its members.

We are very pleased to share with you the results of CargoM's work over the past year, which was characterized by major changes. The end of the year was marked by several departures on the management team. On one hand, our Chairman of the Board, Mr. Martin Imbleau, left his position last September to join the VIA HFR team. On the other, Ms. Madeleine Paquin, such a key figure since the early days of the Cluster, stepped down as Director. She was one of the pioneers who built its reputation and helped extend its reach. We are extremely grateful for her unfailing support, tremendous generosity and dedication over the years. We are also marking the departure of our Executive Director, Mr. Mathieu Charbonneau, who helped set up the Cluster in 2012. With us right from the start, he leaves an important legacy to members, partners and the CargoM team. His involvement over the past 12 years and his contribution to the Cluster and the industry are remarkable on many levels. We wish Mathieu every success in his new career, where many exciting challenges await him. At the time of writing, recruitment is well underway, and we hope to announce the appointment of a new Executive Director in the near future. A wind of renewal will blow through CargoM, and we look forward to the coming year with confidence, enthusiasm and dynamic energy.

The CargoM team is continuing its mission to bring together the sector through concerted projects to improve the fluidity of our supply chain. In line with our 2023-2025 strategic plan, a number of initiatives, some developed in partnership with other companies, have been set in motion. These actions are designed to improve the performance, resilience and visibility of our important North American hub. One example is the Cap Saint-Laurent project, a directory of players and partners in the Quebec maritime and port sector, which serves as an international showcase and promotes the many advantages of our blue corridor. Similarly, we improved our storage space rental tool, making it easier for businesses to lease surplus space and meet the storage needs of organizations. With funding from partners, we continue our work to make the tool even more efficient and user-friendly. Our industry is still grappling with workforce issues. This is why we are pursuing our projects to promote occupations and training in logistics and freight transport. For the eighth year running, we held our Transport and Logistics Career Day, which brought together about 40 companies and 400 participants. We also organized activities through our Trucking Career Immersion Program (TCIP), offering immersive days to discover all the facets of truck driving. Of course, we'd like to continue these initiatives next year. We seek contributors to help us make future editions a success.

CargoM also works as a transmission belt. Again this year, we brought together our members and stakeholders to discuss issues that largely affect fluidity. Through our working groups, we were able to present the progress on rehabilitating the Louis-Hippolyte-La Fontaine Bridge-Tunnel, as well as innovations affecting the operations of some of our members, including marine terminals.

The Cluster is also positioning itself as an international promoter of the Greater Montreal hub. We met on many occasions at home and abroad with foreign delegations, organizations and private companies in our sector, often facing the same issues. We were fortunate to take part in the German Federal Republic's visitors' program, a great opportunity to learn more about two smart cities, Berlin and Hamburg.

We invite you to read this report for details of CargoM's actions over the past year.

Our directors remain as committed as ever, for which we are very grateful. We are delighted to announce new appointments to our Board of Directors. We welcomed Ms. Julie Gascon, President and CEO of the Montreal Port Authority, taking over from Geneviève Deschamps, Vice-President, Finance, who acted in the interim following the departure of Mr. Martin Imbleau. The departure of Ms. Madeleine Paquin from Logistec Corporation Inc. led to the arrival of Mr. Rodney Corrigan, President of Logistec Stevedoring Inc. Lastly, we are delighted to welcome Mr. Jonathan Hébert, Director of Finance and Growth at Ray-Mont Logistics, who succeeds Mr. Charles Raymond. We would also like to acknowledge the contribution of the members of our four working groups, who remain actively involved in our success. In all, they have contributed almost 1,900 volunteer hours. Our members are mission-critical to fulfill our mandate, and we thank them for their participation and contributions to our success.

Funding from our donors is essential to implement our mission and projects. We take this opportunity to thank the Government of Quebec and the Montreal Metropolitan Community (MMC) for their support.




